

**COMBINED NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

This Notice shall satisfy the above-cited two separate but related procedural notification requirements.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about April 27, 2020 the Grayson County will submit a request to the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974(PL 93-383), as amended, to undertake a project known as Eagle Bottom Phase II Housing Project CIG# 19-14-32, for the purpose of Rehabilitation of 4 LMI owner units and 2 LMI investor owned units and the substantial reconstruction of 3 LMI units and 3 demolitions. This project is along Eagle Bottom Road, Back Alley Lane, Winding Road, and Quarry Road.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The Grayson County has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at The Grayson County Courthouse, County Administration Office, Davis Street, Independence VA 24348 and may be examined or copied weekdays (9) A.M. to (5) P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency disagreeing with this determination or wishing to comment on the project may submit written comments to the Mount Rogers Planning District Commission, attn: Brian Reed, 1021 Terrace Drive, Marion, VA 24354. All comments received by April 24, 2020 will be considered by the Grayson County prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Commenters should specify which part of this Notice they are addressing.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

The Grayson County certifies to DHCD that William Shepley in his capacity as County Administrator consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. DHCD'S approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows Grayson County to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

DHCD will consider objections to its release of funds and the Grayson County certification received by May 12, 2020 or a period of fifteen days from its receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer or other officer of the Grayson County approved by DHCD; (b) the (RE) has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the project have committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by DHCD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to DHCD at:
