CARES Act – Mr. William Shepley gave the following presentation:

2020 HISTORY

- March 11 – Pandemic Declared
- March 13 – Declaration of National Emergency
- March 17 – Declaration of Local Emergency
- March 26 & 27 – CARES Act Passes Senate and Signed Into Law
- May 12 – Local Allocations for Federal CARES Relief Funds Notification Received
- June 1 – Grayson County CARES Allocation Received

CARES ACT OF 2020

- The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act of 2020 provides funding for several different programs to address the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Grayson County received \$1,356,678 based on the county's population (including towns) in proportion to the total state population.

EXAMPLES OF ELIGIBLE USES OF CARES FUNDS

- Certain public facility medical expenses related to the pandemic
- Public health expenses
- Payroll expenses for employees whose services are substantially dedicated to mitigating or responding to the COVID-19 public health emergency
- Expenses related to compliance with COVID-19 public health measures
- Expenses associated with economic support in connection with the COVID-19 emergency

ECONOMIC SUPPORT

- Expenditures related to the provision of grants to small businesses to reimburse the cost of business interruption caused by closures related to the pandemic.

GRAYSON COUNTY SMALL BUSINESS RECOVERY COMMITTEE

A group of interested small business owners stepped up and volunteered to assist the small business community through the economic crisis. Their efforts combined with staff created the Grayson Co. Small Business Recovery Committee.

WHY IS THE CARES ACT GRANT NEEDED?

- Over 100 Grayson County Businesses applied for Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Funds
- Numerous businesses or “micro businesses” were not eligible or didn’t meet requirements
- Some businesses still need help

WHAT THE SMALL BUSINESS RECOVERY COMMITTEE RECOMENDS?

- Grayson County (BOS) allocate \$300,000 from CARES Act monies to support local businesses
- Each business can request up to \$3000
 - How did we arrive at \$3000?
- Businesses must meet the following requirements:



Grayson County Small Business Recovery Funds

Our people and their small businesses are important to our county. We want to help you navigate these difficult times. As a county we have made funds available to help our small business community.

Support for Grayson County Small Business impacted by COVID-19 will be made available to businesses in Grayson County starting July 15 2020. Relief Funds in the amount of up to \$3,000.00 grants can be used for critical operating expenses to offset some of the impacts of the shutdown. Critical expenses include but are not limited to payroll, operating and reopening expenses.

Supervisor Fant recommends that the drop-off location (page 3) for the applications be changed from the Extension Center to the GATE Center. Supervisor Fant the asked if the expenditures that are associated with marketing reimbursable through the CARES Act? Mrs. Gayheart responded that it is associated with economic recovery for the small businesses and is covered under the CARES Act as a qualifying event. Deb Jones noted that everything that is listed under eligible expenses have been deemed eligible expenses for the small businesses to be recovered. Supervisor Fant noted his concern regarding the expenses that the County will incur to implement the program and Ms. Jones noted yes, they are reimbursable. Supervisor Fant also inquired about the salary portion for Mrs. Erin Cox – is her part of the salary reimbursable through the recovery program? Mr. Shepley stated he’s spoken with Mr. Danny Peek of the Virginia

Cooperative Extension office and he's good with Mrs. Cox helping the County with the Small Business application process and if there's a need for salary reimbursement, it is eligible through the CARES Act money. As of now, Mr. Peek has not requested a reimbursement. We will monitor her time on this and then meet back with Mr. Peek in a month to discuss further. Mr. Shepley then thanked Virginia Tech and Skyline National Bank for their support to the small businesses during this pandemic. Supervisor Fant then pointed out potentially looking at a larger number than the \$3,000. Mr. Butler stated that the Small Business Recovery Committee could come back to the Board in 30 days with an update. Mr. Shepley then thanked Mr. Butler for his dedication and hard work for the small businesses in our area. Supervisor Sutherland made the motion to approve the Grayson County Small Business; duly seconded by Supervisor Hash. Motion carried 5-0.

Mr. Shepley noted that within the CARES Act we will be able to help the not-profit food banks with some money to help them continue to provide much needed food for citizens in need. Mrs. Gayheart added that the non-profits through-out the County, regardless of the services they provide to our citizens will be the next step, not only within the CARES Act but leveraging the CARES Act with a grant through DHCD which would impact as many non-profits as possible and could potentially include Fire and Rescue. Mr. Shepley also noted that money can be provided for our front-line workers which would include Sheriff's Department, Department of Social Services, Department of Public Works, Maintenance, Janitors and our First Responders and a meeting will take place soon with the department heads of those mentioned to discuss a standard hazard pay for them. Mrs. Gayheart stated that Deb Jones has done research on this and there is a minimum and a maximum pay rate that individuals can receive. It will be a number of per hours worked – it cannot be stipend or a bonus. Supervisor Fant inquired about the categories of those Mr. Shepley mentioned who are eligible - janitors, cafeteria workers for the schools – and asked if anyone from the school system is included in this? Mr. Shepley stated the schools have received CARES Act money separately from the County so the school should be able to provide the same thing to their workers. Supervisor Hash made the motion to approve the Not-For-Profit and the Hazard Pay; duly seconded by Supervisor Revels. Motion carried 5-0.

If the repeal ordinance is adopted, staff will have to get plans, inspection reports, and all documents that we would have in house will have to be sent to DEQ. We will have to meet with DEQ on any open inspections. Erosion and Sediment inspections will still be reviewed out of the Building Officials Office. Supervisor Fant inquired about 4 stormwater projects since 2014 – with 2 being added most recently – Food City and a Hazard Mitigation Bank Grant which is for stormwater credits. The one for Food City is being reviewed by Mr. Clegg Williams out of Smyth County. Currently have a total of 6. Supervisor Fant inquired about increasing the process time since it will now go through the state instead of the county and Mrs. Black noted that yes, there will additional time wait so we will need to be upfront and let them know this. The plan reviewers with DEQ have 30 days to review the plans. Supervisor Fant then inquired about the change and getting the word out to everyone in the county. Mrs. Black stated their office will be getting it out and will also be placed on our website. IN RE: PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX RELIEF 2020

Mr. Shepley read the memo from Larry D. Bolt, Commissioner of Revenue and Raymond L. Hall, Jr, Treasurer (listed below) regarding personal property car tax relief. Supervisor Fant made the motion to ratify; duly seconded by Supervisor Sutherland. Motion carried 5-0.

2020 Grayson County Personal Property Tax Relief

In accordance with the requirements set forth in Section 58.1-3521 (2) AND Section 58.1-3912 (E) of the Code of Virginia, as amended by Chapter 1 of the Acts of Assembly (2004 Special Session 1) and as set forth in Item 503.E (Personal Property Tax Relief Program) of Chapter 951 of the 2005 Acts of Assembly, any qualifying vehicle situs within the County commencing January 1, 2020 shall receive personal property tax relief in the following manner:

- Personal use vehicles valued at \$1,000 or less will be eligible for 100% tax relief of the 1997 levy.
- Personal use vehicles valued at \$1,001 to \$20,000 will be eligible for 50% tax relief of the 1997 levy.
- Personal use vehicles valued at \$20,001 or more shall only receive 50% tax relief on the first \$20,000 of value. AND,
- Pursuant to authority conferred in Item 503.D of the 2005 Appropriations act, the County Treasurer shall issue a supplemental personal property tax bill in the amount of 100 percent of tax due without regard to any former entitlement to state PPTRA relief, plus applicable penalties and interest, to any taxpayer whose taxes with respect to a qualifying vehicle for tax year 2005 or any prior tax year remain unpaid on September 1, 2006, or such date as state funds for reimbursement of the state share of such bill have become unavailable, whichever occurs first.
- Penalty and interest with respect to bills issued pursuant to this section shall be computed on the entire amount of tax owed. Interest shall be computed at the rate provided in Section 9-51 from the original due date of the tax.

Based upon previous year's PPTRA numbers and our technical knowledge, this is the 2020 PPTRA rate.

IN RE: COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

William L. Shepley gave the following report:

On 6 July 2020, Grayson County took a major step in the COVID-19 recovery by entering Phase III of the recovery process. As there are variations in how each jurisdiction in the Commonwealth of Virginia approaches this step in the recovery, we want to give our citizens some of the specific steps that Grayson County is taking.

- All Government Offices – All county government offices are reopened to the public except the Department of Social Services. Office hours are back to normal and we are happy to be engaging with our citizens again on a more regular basis. As COVID-19 is still with us, we are taking appropriate precautions to protect our citizens and employees: face masks covering the mouth and nose are required for everyone entering county facilities. Masks are available for anyone who does not have one. Just ask any employee and one will be provided. We also have hand sanitizer available in all public spaces, offices and restrooms and encourage frequent use.
- Grayson County Department of Social Services – GCDSS, under the guidance of the Commonwealth of Virginia, will not be reopening their physical offices until 4 September 2020. All services continue to be available by appointment by calling 276-773-2752.
- Grayson County Parks & Recreation – Most Parks & Recreation facilities & a few activities are slowly returning to operation with some restrictions. Ball fields and courts are available to the public with the exception being when tournament activities have reservations. The public pool is open to a capacity of 125 persons. To ensure appropriate social distancing, poolside furniture is not available, but citizens may bring their own for their visits. Little league activities are not available because of the inability to maintain social distancing.
- Grayson County Public Works – Beginning 15 July, 2020 all county recycling centers will reopen for cardboard, office paper, newspaper, shredded paper, magazines, aluminum cans and steel of all types. Please note that #1 & #2 plastics may only be recycled at the Public Works location at 1216 N. Independence Avenue, Independence, VA.
- Grayson County Public Library – The library continues to offer services online and by phone and offer pick-up services by appointment only. Call 276-773-2761 for further information.
- Grayson County Public Schools – GCPS will open for the 2020-2021 school year on 13 August, 2020. Students will attend Monday through Thursday. School facilities will be cleaned on Fridays. Parents may also choose to continue remote learning until after Labor Day or the end of the first 9-week period if they choose.

Mr. Shepley emphasized that we are able to take these actions because the actions taken to date have worked well and because you, our citizens, have made public health and safety a priority over convenience and comfort. Your efforts in social distancing, wearing masks in public settings and frequent handwashing have helped to keep the number of positive COVID-19 cases in Grayson County low and controllable. Please remember that even as we progress through the reopening process, COVID-19 remains with us and continues to be a life-threatening illness for many who contract it. We must remain vigilant and not let our success to date let us become complacent or we may find ourselves having to reconsider or reverse our reopening actions as many of our

neighbor states and communities are doing at present. Thank you for all that you have done and continue to do for each of our fellow citizens. Be safe, get outside, and please enjoy our summer in beautiful Grayson County. We Are Grayson County!
